Our Programs

Children's Long Term Support (CLTS)* and Children's Community Options Program (CCOP)*

CLTS and CCOP make funds available to support children who have significant limitations due to developmental, emotional and or physical disabilities.

Comprehensive **Community Services (CCS)**

CCS is a community-based service that offers an array of services to vouth with mental health and/or substance use disorders.

Coordinated Services Team (CST)

CST provides wraparound services to families with children who are involved in two or more systems of care and have complex needs. Systems of care include special education, mental health or substance use services, juvenile justice or child welfare.

Eligibility

CLTS and CCOP

- Physical Disability and/or
- Developmental Disability and/or
- Mental Illness

CCS

- Mental Illness and/or
- Substance Use Disorder
- Need services more than those provided by outpatient counseling and psychiatry

CST

- 2 or more Systems of Care
- Other interventions have not been successful over time
