



Membership Process

The qualifications for membership are:

- Age 18 or older
- All applicants need to have a primary diagnosis of SPMI ("serious and persistent mental illness" schizophrenia, bi-polar disorder, major depression, schizoaffective disorder, etc.).
- All applicants should have an interest in participating in the Clubhouse program, as attendance is voluntary.
- *Diagnosis will need to be confirmed, prior to tour.*

Steps to follow

1. Complete Tour Request and submit to Clubhouse.
2. Attend Clubhouse Tour
3. Join Clubhouse and become member and complete Clubhouse Orientation.
