






Oracle Cerner Tip: PASSWORD RESET

Security questions allow users to independently reset password

Having ability to independently complete a Cerner password reset comes in handy when pressed for time. Make sure to set up security questions before a reset is necessary with Cerner Password Setup and Reset Job Aid from Information Systems Libraries.

- 1. Double click Cerner Prod from desktop.
- 2. Click Account Self-Service.
- 3. Click Forgotten Password.
- 4. Type Cerner Username and click Search.
- 5. Type security answers in blank fields and click Check Answers.
- 6. Type new password in New Password field.
- 7. Type new password again in Confirm Password field.
- 8. Click Change Password.


LOGGING IN TO UKG LEARNING

- 4. Locate and view desired content and documents here.




