HELPING A COWORKER DURING DIFFICULT TIMES Son Struck By SUV Getting Off Bus



EMPLOYEE PARKING NOTICE FOR EVENT



NOTICE: NCHC MERRILL CENTER TEMPORARILY RELOCATED TO LINCOLN **COUNTY SERVICE CENTER**

801 N. Sales Street, Merrill -**Lower Level Room 166**

Effective Monday, June 5, all NCHC Merrill Center operations have been temporarily relocated to the Lincoln County Service Center, one block to the north at 801 N. Sales Street, Merrill, in the Lower Level Room 166. Use the Lower Level parking area to access the building. It is anticipated that these arrangements will be for approximately 2 weeks while the air conditioning unit is being repaired, but a definite date has not been established.

Staff will continue to provide Outpatient and Community Treatment Services from this temporary

location. All phones and patient access staff will continue to be working at the new location as well, with phones still operating using the Merrill Center phone numbers. Signage will be posted to help people navigate to the temporary location.

Due to the air conditioning malfunctions in the building, the temperatures on the Merrill Center NCHC floor were too hot to offer comfortable or safe conditions for clients, visitors, or staff. Thank you to all the staff who have collaborated quickly to make this temporary move happen. Lincoln County Facilities is working to get the unit repaired as fast as possible.

omplacency can sneak ■up on you. With complacency, you risk neglecting safety procedures



and protocols, or you may overlook other dangers associated with a hazardous task. Complacency causes many unintentional workplace accidents and injuries. Think of familiarity and routine as the "birth parents" of complacency. To be on guard, understand that the more frequently an individual engages in an unsafe practice or disregards safety measures resulting from complacency, the higher the likelihood an accident will occur. Eventually, this risk rises to near certainty. This dynamic is also known as the "Law of Large Numbers."

healthcare. If you're a man, avoid falling prey to societal or cultural influences that can shorten your life. Reject 1) "powering through illness"— feeling pressure to display toughness and self-reliance; 2) "dismissing the small stuff"—ignoring minor symptoms of health problems; 3) "fear"—delaying preventive healthcare to avoid bad news. embarrassment, invasive procedures, or discussion of "sensitive" topics; 4) "lack of health curiosity"—not being savvy about men's health issues, getting the right information, and understanding your susceptibly to illnesses, which often are curable in the early stages.






