






1100 LAKE VIEW DRIVE BUILDING **CLOSED UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE**

WSAW TV 7 EXPLORES HOW MARATHON COUNTY IS USING OPIOID SETTLEMENT FUNDS

Multi-Part Series Explores NCHC and Marathon County Services

Hannah Borchert of WSAW TV 7 interviewed NCHC staff and our community partners for a multi-part series on how Marathon County is using Opioid Settlement funds to counteract the opioid crisis in Central Wisconsin. On February 25, 2022, the Wisconsin Department of Justice announced final approval of an agreement with the nation's three major pharmaceutical distributors (Cardinal, McKesson, and AmerisourceBergen) and Johnson & Johnson. Wisconsin is due to receive more than \$740 million in total funding through 2038. 2021 Wisconsin Act 57 requires that the 87 local governments that participated in this litigation receive 70 percent of the funds, with the state receiving 30 percent of the funds. 

We will kick off the year learning about behavioral health, a broad term that can refer to clinical mental health diagnoses, addiction issues, domestic violence, and sexual assault. Participants will better understand how United Way of Marathon County is addressing financial stability by working on behavioral health issues.

At this event you will hear from Dakota Kaiser, PhD. Dakota is the Integrated Services Director at Bridge Community Health Clinic, which provides health services to the underseved, underinsured, elef-paid and insured population of Marathon County, including many behavioral health services. Dakota will address the types of behavioral health issues that are facing patients in Marathon County, and how Bridge Clinic's role is critical to helping people achieve financial stability.

Following the presentation, you will participate in a brief project building calm kits for local schools. Calm kits include tools and information that help children with self-regulation strategies. Teachers and parents love these kits, and we plan to assemble around 200 of them to share with school counselors in Marathon County!

NAMI Family-to-Family is a free, 8-session education program for family, friends and significant others of adults with mental health conditions. NAMI Family-to-Family provides information about anxiety, depressive disorders, schizophrenia, bipolar disorder and other mental health conditions. Other topics covered include communication, problem solving, treatment and recovery.

The course is designed to increase understanding and advocacy skills while helping participants maintain their own well-being. The program is taught by trained family members who have a loved one with a mental health condition. NAMI Family-to-Family is an evidence-based program (EB).
