I wanted to give everyone an update regarding Pine Crest. I had sent out two emails to employees last week regarding the Pine Crest situation and I thought it would be good to give a little more information regarding this situation. On June 28th, Lincoln County received a letter from the attorney of the potential buyer for Pine Crest. In the letter, which can be found on Lincoln County's web-

site, the attorney claims that Lincoln County is in default of the Asset Purchase Agreement due to a pending lawsuit and therefore they elected to terminate the Agreement and not purchase the nursing home.

The transfer of Pine Crest was initially supposed to happen on July 1st, but that date was extended to October 1st at the last County Board meeting. After Lincoln County received the letter, the Administrative & Legislative Committee for Lincoln County amended their agenda for the July 2nd meeting to add an item that stated, "Pine Crest Sale Discussion." At the Committee meeting, they discussed the letter, and it was confirmed that the sale of Pine Crest was terminated and that there was no longer a pending sale or buyer for the nursing home.

What this all means, is that NCHC will continue to run Pine Crest as we have done for the past four and half years. It is also important to know that NCHC has a current contract with Lincoln County to run the nursing home through 2025.

I would like to personally thank all the employees at Pine Crest for their devotion to their jobs and the individuals they serve. The employees have been on a roller coaster of a ride over the last two years as the possible sale of Pine Crest has been discussed. Through all of this, they demonstrated our CORE VALUES of Dignity, Integrity, and Accountability. Above all they showed great Person-Centered Service as they continued to do their jobs and serve the residents.

The joy and excitement were palpable as each person returned, thrilled by the experience and the opportunity to explore the outdoors in such a unique way.


