Description: AMSR is a one-day training workshop for behavioral health professionals. The 6.5-hour training program is based on the latest research and designed to help participants provide safer suicide care. Health care providers face many challenges when working with patients and clients at risk for suicide. Some patients may not disclose thoughts of suicide, and even when they do, the health care provider must make judgement calls about unpredictable outcomes, often with insufficient or contradictory information. This training will develop the five areas of competency for AMSR:

- 1. Approaching Your Work
- 2. Understanding Suicide
- 3. Gathering Information
- 4. Formulating Risk
- 5. Planning and Responding

Topic: Trauma Awareness Training

Description: As human services continue to evolve, it is critical for teams to understand the impact of traumatic experiences on a person's worldview and neurobiology, resulting in triggers, adaptive behaviors, and repeating the cycle of trauma. During this training teams come to know more deeply and appreciate the variety of experiences that can be termed "traumatic" and how those experiences manifest differently in each person. Participants will explore:

- Trauma's impact on a person's world-view, brain development, adaptive behaviors and triggers
- Trauma Types: Historical, Gender, Community and Interpersonal
- Impacts of Traumatic Stress on a person's cognition and affect
- Overviews on effective healing interventions
- How to educate and ground served persons
